

WINNING SPINS

THE DRUMMER IS AT THE HEART of a band: an integral part of the control center, presiding over tempo, pace, dynamics and that more elusive quality that gives the music its resonance and emotional feel. That's why jazz drummers have often made memorable leaders. They marshal the divergent components of an ensemble into a cohesive unit. Two of today's most creative and original drummer/bandleaders are represented in this Winning Spins in new albums by small groups with a surprising variety of musical sounds and moods. **Matt** Wilson explores a broad swath of repertoire with his Quartet plus pianist John Medeski, while Mauricio de Souza features two ensembles: Bossa Brasil and the Maurício de Souza Group in various quartet and quintet combinations.

Gathering Call, Matt Wilson Quartet + John Medeski (Palmetto), is, on its surface, that familiar staple of modern, mainstream jazz: the quintet boasting a trumpet (cornet here)-sax front line backed by piano, bass and drums. Some of the repertoire even comes from or references hard bop. Yet this band sounds like no other similarly instrumented quintet, largely because its book is unique. Moody, quirky and sly Wilson originals share space with covers of not-quitestandards ranging from Duke Ellington and boogaloo to a Beyoncé hit and an antebel-

lum popular song.

The CD literally jumps off with Duke's "Main Stem," energized as post-modern jump swing driven by Wilson at his most extroverted; Kirk Knuffle's cornet and Jeff Lederer's tenor sax following the theme with short trades and tandem solos leading into a drum break intro to Medeski's piano soloing over horn riffs before the band takes

it out on a checkered flag.
With the addition of Medeski, Wilson's pianoless quartet, which has suggested roots in early Ornette Coleman and Gerry Mulligan, falls squarely in the piano combo tradition. Medeski evokes Ellington's comping and interactions with horn riffs on "Main Stem." He channels the Duke's feel, and even elements of his original solo, on "You Dirty Dog," plucked from the Impulse! small group date, *Duke Ellington Meets Coleman Hawkins*; Lederer also solos in homage to Hawkins.

Wilson's thunderous Assembly Required," wherein riffs vie with drum outbreaks throughout, Medeski flings on Monk-like dissonances and Herbie Nichols phrases; but he also gets downright funky on Charlie Rouse's boogaloo, "Pumpkin's Delight," and grooves with the bluesy shuffle of Hugh Lawson's "Get Over, Get Off and Get On." For the last track, he's out front in a standard trio setting: a sentiment-laden version of "Juanita," also known as "The Spanish Ballad," a popular 1850s

song by a Mrs. Norton.

A tinkling piano and shimmering clarinet/cornet line brighten Butch Warren's "Barack Obama," one of two striking covers. The other is a tenderly ruminative take on Beyoncé's worldwide hit, "If I Were A Boy," with shifting rhythms and a plaintive cornet lead. Wilson's originals range from the diaphanous "Dancing Waters" to the compelling, stately "Hope (For the Cause)" with arco bass and clarinet prominent. On "How Ya Going!" his tour-de-force avant-drumming propels a rave-up honoring late 1950s Ornette.

Different Directions, Bossa Brasil and Maurício de Souza Group (Pulsa Music), finds the drummer from Brazil exploring his musical roots in his home country and his adopted one. His sure, suave rhythms, smooth stick propulsion and shimmering cymbal work create elegant frameworks for his ensembles. He also memorably arranged all but one of the

tracks, including two originals.

From Brazil he has culled "Ponteio" with cool, racing rhythms supporting solos from pianist Marc Copland and Jerry Weir on vibes, and a pair of bossas: Tom Jobim's famous "Vivo Sonhando (Dreamer)" and Ney Rosauro's "Prelude." The former features a mellow Mike Stern on guitar who is equally lyrical on "Invitation," cast in contrasting 12/8 and 4/4. The latter evokes tenderness with Sharel Cassity's lyric alto sax,

vibes and John Lee's electric bass.

The impressive "Los Vamos Nos," a maracatu by Luiz Eca, finds Cassity and Greg Gisbert overdubbing reed and brass sections and de Souza's chart incorporating martial flamenco rhythms and mariachi trumpet, as well as alto sax and flute solos. Post-bop is celebrated on a crack uptempo Chick Corea tune, "Straight Up and Down." De Souza pays splendid tribute to his late teacher, Joe Morello, by recasting Dizzy Gillespie's "Con Alma" in 5/4, re-creating the Dave Brubeck Quartet instrumentation, and playing a solo Morello would appreciate, especially for the integrated, melodic use of bass drum.

The Matt Wilson Quartet with John Medeski plays The SideDoor Jan. 28 and Dizzy's Club Coca-Cola Jan. 30 to Feb. 2. Maurício de Souza leads bands at Papillon 25 in South Orange on Jan. 30 and at Jazz at Kitano, Feb. 5.





Dena DeRose is one of a few singing jazz pianists who excel in both roles. Her refined, sultry vocals and inventive approach to familiar songs, along with an assertive ability to play a wide range of styles have drawn critical praise. The New York native has spent much of the past decade teaching and playing in Europe and she has released ten acclaimed CDs as a leader, with Travelin' Light: Live in Antwerp, Belgium being the latest. Her trio includes drummer Matt Wilson and bassist Martin Wind, with whom she has recorded and toured for several years. Guest trumpeter Jeremy Pelt will be added for the Jan. 2 show. DeRose plans to make a new studio recording of her trio on Jan. 4 and 5 for an upcoming CD. KD



CHRISTIAN McBRIDE

VILLAGE VANGUARD / JANUARY 7-12, 14-19

Since Philadelphian bassist Christian McBride hit the Big Apple in 1989 at 17, he's been in full stride—becoming one of the most prolific recording artists not only in jazz, but also making records in the pop, rock, funk, rhythm and blues and even classical fields. A musician with a big, buoyant tone and feel, he also plays get-down electric bass guitar and performed with the late Godfather of Soul, James Brown. McBride also has distinguished himself as a leader of various sized ensembles from his straight-ahead jazz quintet, Inside Straight, to his funky A Christian McBride Situation. At the Vanguard, he'll showcase his big band, The Good Feeling; during the second week his young trio featuring pianist Christian Sands and drummer Ulysses Owens will take the stage. GK



MARCUS STRICKLAND SMOKE / JANUARY 2-3

Saxophonist Marcus Strickland commands the stage with an arsenal of melodic ambition. With JazzWise magazine stating that Strickland is "one of the most creative and adventurous saxophonists on the NYC scene," one can understand him being in such demand. With stints in the bands of drummer Jeff "Tain" Watts and trumpeter Dave Douglas peppered on his résumé, the elder statesmen of jazz have taken notice of his musical voice. As a leader, Strickland embodies the robust, post-bop sound by adding equal parts melody and groove. His most recent releases as a leader are 2011's Triumph of the Heavy, Vol. 1 & 2, released on his very own Strick Muzik label. Strickland brings his quartet to Smoke as part of the club's COUNTDOWN 2014: A John Coltrane Festival. EW



THE CLAUDIA QUINTET

CORNELIA STREET CAFÉ / JANUARY 9-10

Acclaimed composer, bandleader and percussionist John Hollenbeck moves far forward into the depths of creative, written modern jazz sounds, spiked with 100 proof improvisation. The Claudia Quintet is his most prolific vehicle for putting innovative new music to the test. While listenable and even tuneful, the small ensemble pushes boundaries, hints at tradition and paves a personal path into the future. Their new CD, September (Cuneiform), perfectly depicts that month of transition with equal elements of melancholy and color variations. Hollenbeck has just received his fourth Grammy nomination for arranging the standard "The Moon Is A Harsh Mistress," on the CD Songs I Like A Lot. The band includes Chris Speed on woodwinds, Red Weirenga playing accordion, vibraphonist Matt Moran and Drew Gress on upright bass. MGN



GILAD HEKSELMAN

JAZZ GALLERY / JANUARY 10

During his decade in New York City, Israeli guitarist Gilad Hekselman has established himself as a musical talent to watch. While certainly influenced by artists like Pat Metheny and Kurt Rosenwinkel, Hekselman has forged a sound uniquely his own, brandishing a bright, clear tone and improvising with subtle yet memorable melodic gifts. His prodigious skills can be heard on several well-received solo albums, particularly his most recent: the outstanding This Just In. Hekselman's Jazz Gallery performance finds him in like-minded and talented company featuring Shai Maestro on piano and Fender Rhodes and Obed Calvaire on drums. This represents a new turn in Hekselman's career as he forgoes a bass player, instead sharing bassline duties with the keyboards. This should prove to be a fascinating and enjoyable outing. SH

BILLY CHILDS

JAZZ AT LINCOLN CENTER / JANUARY 24-25

Billy Childs was one of the promising pianists to emerge in the 1980s. Influenced by Herbie Hancock and Thelonious Monk, Childs never allowed himself to be pigeonholed as a bop stylist. The Los Angeles native studied composition at USC and, after graduating in 1979, his apprenticeships over the next few years included touring and recording with both Freddie Hubbard and J. J. Johnson. Childs made his debut recording as a leader in 1988 for Windham Hill Jazz. Although he primarily works in trio settings, he has composed chamber music and written film soundtracks. These concerts will feature a trio with Scott Colley on bass and Brian Blade on drums, joined by the Ying String Quartet, all of whom played on his CD Autumn in Moving Pictures. KD



BILL O'CONNELL ZINC BAR / JANUARY 9

Pianist Bill O'Connell may have an Irish name, but Latin jazz runs strong through his musical blood. He has worked as the keyboardist for a litany of greats including Gato Barbieri, Mongo Santamaria and Dave Valentin. This gig with his Latin Jazz All-Stars follows the release of his vibrant and wide-ranging CD, Zócalo (Savant). His band mates at Zinc Bar include trombonist Conrad Herwig, saxophonist Steve Slagle, Cuban percussionist Roman Díaz, bassist Luques Curtis and drummer Richie Morales. O'Connell's exciting rice-and-beans take on jazz transcends the styles of his source material, some of which are originals while others have Latin folk roots or come from the American Popular Songbook. Wait until you hear the band's take on Rodgers and Hammerstein's "The Surrey with the Fringe on Top." KF



AARON WEINSTEIN

SAINT PETER'S CHURCH / JANUARY 29

Aaron Weinstein was a musical prodigy, inspired by the recordings of greats like Joe Venuti and Stephane Grappelli. Weinstein is steeped in the history of jazz violin and excels in his interpretations of swing favorites, though he also has his ears open for overlooked gems. Weinstein won numerous awards while in high school and earned a four-year scholarship to Berklee. After college, the Chicago native relocated to New York City, where he has recorded or played with Bucky and John Pizzarelli, Skitch Henderson, Howard Alden, Frank Vignola, Michael Feinstein and Jessica Molaskey, occasionally playing mandolin, too. His just released CD Lucky Day (Birdland Records), features Tedd Firth, Tom Hubbard, Warren Vaché and Bucky Pizzarelli. His duo partner at Saint Peter's will be pianist Matt Baker. KD



DARRELL GRANT JAZZ STANDARD / JANUARY 15

Whether soloing or accompanying an instrumentalist, pianist Darrell Grant strengthens the harmonic core of the jazz ensemble with his impeccable ear and robust phrasing. Gracing concert stages, festivals and jazz clubs, Grant applies strong melodic devices and storytelling elements into a unique blend that has been called upon by singer Betty Carter and saxophonist Chico Freeman. As a leader, Grant's efforts have been met with critical acclaim with his latest album, 2007's Truth and Reconciliation, garnering accolades from major outlets such as JazzTimes and AllAboutJazz. For this performance, Grant will premiere his piece commissioned by Chamber Music America: "The Territory," a work he describes as "where jazz, blues, gospel, folk, classical and rock music are the rivers, valleys, mountain peaks and quiet retreats." BORIS KOZLOV TRIBECA PAC / FEBRUARY 6

Bassist Boris Kozlov has come a long way since emigrating from Russia in 1991, most notably filling the shoes of the 20th century's most iconic bassist-composer-bandleader: Charles Mingus. For well over a decade, Kozlov has held down the bass chair in, and has been musical director of, the Mingus Dynasty, Mingus Big Band and Mingus Orchestra, one of which appears each Monday night at Jazz Standard. Kozlov, who began garnering jazz prizes in Moscow, has two Grammy Awards and has recorded on more than eight score albums. He also leads his own project: Malfunction Alibi. Kozlov, who most enjoys "the conversational aspects" of playing bass, will be part of the Highlights in Jazz 41st anniversary celebration along with Lew Tabackin, Randy Brecker, Toshiko Akiyoshi, Kenny Barron and Harvie S. **GK**



BOBBY BROOM

Born and raised in New York City, guitarist Bobby Broom first found excitement in the sounds of organist Charles Earland in the early 70s. Broom's determination succeeded in landing him work with piano greats Al Haig and Walter Bishop, Jr. and trumpet titans Hugh Masekela and Miles Davis. Further attention for Broom's abilities would come with his five-year association with Sonny Rollins, touring and appearing on Rollins' No Problem and Reel Life (Milestone) recordings. Other releases with Earland, Kenny Burrell, Rollins and David Murray are alongside five CDs with The Deep Organ Trio, co-founded by Broom, and ten albums under his own leadership. The latest, Upper West Side Story (Origin) will be the focus as Broom is joined by bassist Dennis Carroll and drummer Makaya McCraven.



IGOR BUTMAN

CENTENARY COLLEGE / JANUARY 11

A saxophone virtuoso, bandleader, club owner and television host, Igor Butman is certainly Russia's outstanding jazz ambassador. Butman first gained U.S. attention when arriving to attend Berklee College of Music. However, back home he had already played with Dave Brubeck, Chick Corea, Pat Metheny and Grover Washington, Jr. who would feature Butman's big tenor sound on Then And Now (Columbia). He also has been a regular guest of the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra with which his own band has impressively gone head to head. Butman, whose talents have drawn praise from former President Clinton, has appeared at festivals worldwide, leading one reviewer to note: "Igor was impressive with a round tone and deft ability at double time efforts and tight harmonization."



BENITO GONZALEZ

MAKEDA / JANUARY 2

Born into a family of Venezuelan folk musicians, pianist Benito Gonzalez started to receive attention by taking home first place honors at the Great American Piano Competition. Soon afterward, he found himself touring and recording with Christian McBride, Azar Lawrence, Bobby Hutcherson, Roy Hargrove and Steve Turre. Most recently, Gonzalez has been the featured pianist on Kenny Garrett's Grammy-nominated Seeds from the Underground and Pushing the World Away Mack Avenue recordings. Gonzalez's second CD, Circles (Furthermore), expanded the attention, described by some as a "McCoy Tyner feel infused with his own challenging style." In New Brunswick, expect Gonzalez and his quartet to do originals like "Taurus" and "Let's Talk About You And Me," along with some jazz classics.

NICHOLAS PAYTON

Music is a Communal Expression

In the Past Two Years, Nicholas Payton has become an outspoken figure in the music most people call jazz with his advocacy of referring to his music as Black American Music or #BAM. A few times a month, the trumpeter posts a well-written, thoroughly reasoned article on his blog www.nicholaspayton.wordpress.com. He advocates for #BAM, calls out musicians and journalists he thinks are disrespecting or failing Black music or people and addresses other cultural topics.

"I look at it all as an extension of my artistry," Payton says. "Writing music is one; playing my trumpet is another and playing keyboard is another. It's all artistic

expression.'

Speaking on Skype after a gig in Japan, Payton explained #BAM. "I'm not looking to change people's minds about jazz and I don't consider what I do jazz. People think I'm on a crusade to ban the word jazz and I couldn't care less what people decide to call what they do personally. But I don't view the spirit of the music as jazz at all and, in fact, it's not," he says. "This is certainly no new argument because Duke Ellington saw 80 years ago that it was problematic. He wanted to call it Negro Music: to attach it to the community because it's a communal expression. It's not a genre and it's not a category."

The group at his upcoming Birdland gig is called Action Affirmative but has nothing to do with his #BAM doctrine. "It's just a silly name," he says. The band will include pianist Aaron Parks, with whom has never played. "I'm a fan of his work and we've chatted about doing something for a while," Payton said of Parks who has played with Terence Blanchard and is a member of James Farm with Joshua

Redman.

Payton has played with drummer Bill Stewart on gigs with Kevin Hays and Dr. Lonnie Smith, and Vicente Archer has been Payton's regular bassist for a while. "I'm looking forward to connecting with these guys. I'm going to pull out some things that I've written but have been waiting for the right type of situation to play and we'll throw in some standards.

"I look for good listeners, musically speaking." Payton says of how he chooses musicians. "I don't talk or coach much verbally if I can help it and I try not to be heavy-handed with criticism. I believe in hiring the right people for the job. I'm not going to hire Herbie Hancock expecting McCoy Tyner. The whole point of playing creative, expressive, improvisational music is to allow people to bring their voices to

create a more dynamic pallet. I don't want clones of me on every instrument."

In fact, Payton doesn't need clones because he plays all the instruments. He often accompanies his band on piano while playing trumpet. His ability to turn around the groove with a few well-placed notes on piano can be heard on his gigs, including the first release on his own BMF record label, #BAM Live at Bohemian Caverns. That kind of musical connection and his philosophy of not coaching verbally are reminiscent of Miles Davis.

"At this point, Miles is my favorite musician, period," Payton says. "I understand his music so intimately that for me it's not even about a style, but conjuring a spirit that at any moment I can call upon to walk

through me."

He recently undertook a large project in recording, live, the music of the Miles Davis/Gil Evans classic, *Sketches of Spain*, with the Sinfonieorchester Basel. He released it as the second issue on his label on his 40th birthday. It was a risky, controversial move to take on such an iconic recording but the press has been good.

Payton has a studio in his home in New Orleans and has overdubbed himself on tunes playing all the instruments and he has recorded most of his gigs. He has at least five albums' worth of original tunes "in the can" in many styles and instrumentations. With his own label, he says, he no longer has to develop a sales pitch when he wants to make a CD. "When I'm excited about something, I record it and I put it out.

"I like music that feels good and people who play pretty, beautiful music even if we're indulging in some moments where things will lead toward the avant garde," he says. "I don't believe something has to be ugly sounding to be fresh or new or original. Beauty and innovation can co-inhabit the same space."

Nicolas Payton and Action Affirmative with Aaron Parks, Vicente Archer and Bill Stewart will be at Birdland Jan. 21-25.

But rather than talking about what he refers to as his "freelance work," the vibist is more excited about what's coming up for him this month—a two-night duo gig with pianist Kenny Barron at Jazz at Kitano.

"Kenny's my hero," Sherman says from his New York City home. "So these two great nights are going to be pretty big for me. We're also working on a deal to record

this duo for Chesky Records."

Since both are on the Julliard jazz faculty, they've played together before and Sherman recently recorded with Barron, bassist Rufus Reid and drummer Carl Allen for saxophonist Tim Haggerty's debut album, which is due out later this month on Sherman's own Miles High Records. Sherman's admiration of Barron is not surprising since he started out on piano as a child and has studied with jazz pianists Jaki Byard and Roland Hanna.

He credits Justin DiCiccio, the legendary teacher at LaGuardia High School for Music & Art & Performing Arts in Manhattan, with turning him on to the vibes. Sherman was a member of DiCiccio's LaGuardia big band in the early 1970s where he shared the bandstand with such future jazz standouts as Kenny Washington, Marcus Miller and Bobby Broom.

A pianist who was enamored of the drums, Sherman studied with Elvin Jones at the Percussion Center of New York as a teen. DiCiccio pointed him toward the mallets, he says, "Just when I was craving an instrument I could hit with sticks and still

play harmonies."

Sherman's good drum hands were an asset as he studied mallet instruments as a percussion major at Julliard in the late 1970s while continuing under Jones' teaching and pursuing his piano playing. "I really learned to play the mallets well at Julliard from true masters like Elden "Buster" Bailey, a percussionist with the New York Philharmonic for 50 years," he says. "I mastered classical techniques and the grips for four mallet playing." Now Sherman lets the music dictate whether he'll use two, three or four mallets at a time, preferring to go with more when the context lacks other chordal instruments like piano or guitar.

When Sherman was "spit out of Julliard" with a degree in 1980 he was pro-

pelled naturally into the then plentiful and lucrative freelance and studio scene in the Big Apple. He did jingles, television and film work and performed on pop and jazz recording sessions. Through pianist Mike Renzi, whom he met in the studios, he landed what turned out to be a seven-year gig in Peggy Lee's backup band.

"Through that gig," he explains, "I got into the singers' mafia and ended up doing mostly freelance studio work for a lot of singers." That included, memorably, Lena Horne's last recordings on Blue Note Records. Then guitarist Larry Coryell hired him, "initially as a pianist and because he like my tunes—he's recorded ten of them—but eventually on vibes. I was

with him seven years."

At the dawn of the new millennium, Sherman was cutting back on freelance work and concentrating more on his own music. He started his record company initially as vehicle for his work. But in 2004, he expanded it to an artist-owned label on which others can record while retaining their rights to the masters and the music. The catalogue is approaching 30 albums.

Sherman's two most recent CDs on the label, The L.A. Sessions and Project Them, reveal both his preference for "staying deep in the tradition most of the time" and combining his vibes sound with that of a tenor sax, a favorite of his biggest vibes influence, Milt Jackson. "Bags (Jackson) and Bobby (Hutcherson) are the greatest to me, especially harmonically," he says. It's because of Jackson that Sherman sometimes uses the fans on his vibraphone: "I like that vibrato, especially on the ballads and slower mid-tempos. I also use an EFX with pickups on Project Them." The L.A. Sessions features beloop tunes in an organ trio context, his vibes joining B-3, guitar and drums. Project Them is a more contemporary quintet pairing his vibes with saxophonist Bob Franceschini and a rhythm section.

Mary Halvorson

Everything, all the time, everywhere

With at least nine January gigs on her calendar, guitarist **Mary Halvorson** proves once again that she's among the busiest and most versatile players on the scene. "This is all stuff I'm excited about; it's going to be fun," she says. "This is a great time for new, incredible music. There are a lot of bands in my community I want to work with. I learn so much by working with other musicians and being inspired by them." She kicks off the month with a flurry of Brooklyn events, including fronting her own quintet at BAM Café Jan. 4; next she hits at Korzo Jan. 7 with the collective trio, Sifter, followed by a duo with saxophonist Michael Attias Jan. 8 at Barbès. Then Halvorson is in Manhattan for a couple of Winter Jazzfest sets: Marc Ribot's Ceramic Dog on Jan. 10 and her septet at the Judson Church on Jan. 11. The septet is a rare treat since it's hard to find every-one in New York at the same time. Halvorson also digs the Winter Jazzfest fun as a listener. "I try to check out everything. It's a great way to discover new players and hear a cross-spectrum of what's happening. I'm most interested in hearing people I haven't heard before." (check http://winterjazzfest.com/j/schedule.html for venues and times). She'll wrap up the weekend with Tomas Fujiwara & the Hook Up at the Cornelia Street Café Jan 12. Halvorson and Vic Juris will team up Jan. 19, to pay tribute to Paul Motian at SubCulture, part of the Alternative Guitar Festival. She's back at Cornelia Street on Jan. 24 with Jon Irabagon's trio and finishes the month at The Stone Jan. 31 in two Ribot-fronted bands. The guitarist isn't daunted by the array of styles and band configurations. "It keeps life interesting. I'm pretty organized, that's key. I had an administrative job in an office for five or six years before I was playing jazz full-time and those kinds of skills have been really helpful. I start preparing a few weeks in advance, taking a look at the music, refreshing my memory if it's a group I

haven't worked with recently. That guides what I'm practicing.'

Perfect pitch

Elena Pinderhughes has covered a lot of ground, both literally and figuratively, since she first picked up the flute at age eight. "I fell in love with the look, the sound, the timbre," she says. Within a year, Pinderhughes was proficient enough to play her first gig and in the decade since has performed at Carnegie Hall, SFJAZZ Center, the Kennedy Center and the White House. The California native attended Berkeley High School, whose alumni Benny Green, Akinmusire, Joshua Redman and Lenny Pickett. "Some incredible musicians have come from there," Pinderhughes says. "I try to keep that legacy going." Along the way she realized, "I hear the flute similarly to how I hear the human voice," and added singing to her repertoire. Though she often sang melodies to herself while composing, she felt shy at first about singing. "But I had good mentors. When I sang on a gig, I had a good feeling about it. It's a good way to connect with the audience and it's another way to communicate." Now a New York resident, Pinderhughes is studying flute and voice at Manhattan School of Music and gigging with the likes of Akinmusire, MacArthur fellow Vijay Iyer and Grammy nominee Wayne Wallace. She's excited about making her Big Apple debut as a leader with her sextet at the Jazz Gallery Jan. 16. "I've had the quintet for a while, but when I heard (cellist/vocalist) Ethan Philbrick, the blend was beautiful and I wanted to include him. I'm writing a lot of new material for cello and voice; it will be a new thing for this show."

Active voice

January doesn't bring a post-holiday imp for **Amy London**. The slump singer/educator/composer/actress finds the dark days of winter "a fun time to be home, writing arrangements, getting ready for continued on next page

gigs," including her Jan. 25 concert with her Aperturistic Trio at the Puffin Forum in Teaneck with bassist Harvie S, drummer Steve Williams and pianist James Weidman. London describes all three as "singer-friendly musicians who really listen. That always opens new doors and creates new pathways in a tune." Although she has been playing with the bassist since the 1980s and the drummer for almost a decade, the pianist is a recent and valued addition. The two met last summer at one of the Adventures in Jazz camps that London runs with her husband, guitarist Roni Ben-Hur. "It has been fantastic getting to know James. He has played with some great singers, including Abbey Lincoln. He's also an excellent arranger and composer; I might try writing lyrics to some of his originals. Steve and Harvie also write. I'm going to pick their brains to have them throw ideas my way. The Puffin Forum feels more like a concert hall than a club. For that kind of setting, I can pull out more obscure material, bring a few more originals, a few more ballads. It'll be fun." Look for 2014 to bring at least one new CD release from London: Bridges, consisting of recordings from 1984 to 1990, some of it produced by Fred Hersch and recorded with an all-star band. "It represents an earlier phase of my career that hasn't been released before," she says. When she dug out the masters last year, the two-inch recording tape was on the verge of disinte-gration. "The tape had to be put in the oven. It had to be twice-baked, like a twicebaked potato. That saved the tape and rescued the project." London and Hersch went to high school together in Cincinnati. "It was great to get to know him as an adult and so meaningful to work with such a brilliant artist. It's exciting to have a project coming out with his stamp on it."

Musician-Club Owner's Corner

In 2009, the guitarist, composer and producer Saul Rubin opened ZEB's, a loft-style performance venue in the heart of Chelsea. In doing so, he inaugurated one of New York's underrated performance gems: a Wednesday night jazz vocalist series that has featured some of the art form's greatest talents in an intimate setting. Four years later, ZEB's has maintained its traditions and Rubin continues to prove that he holds one of the more creative and fascinating artistic visions for jazz today.

Rubin's polymath abilities stretch back to some of his earliest experiences in the music industry. "When I first came back to town after college, I was playing club dates, corporate gigs, weddings, parties, whatever I could get," he explains. "I had a family and had to make a living, so I wasn't doing as many jazz gigs. As my kids got older, I got more into recording and technology and became a computer animator full-time and played music on the weekends. I did that for 15 years."

Formally organizing his work into a studio—Zebulon Sound and Light—in 1997, Rubin ultimately found his focus moving more firmly into music. "By 2001, I stopped doing animation and started working on jazz full time," he notes. "I was doing a lot of recording and producing work, while also playing guitar. Then, in 2009 I opened my place: ZEB's. It was a big risk and it was expensive, but I did it anyway. Initially, I started the Wednesday night vocal series to drum up business; that's been really successful and has been the main performance work here.'

While opening a jazz venue in the middle of a recession was quite dangerous, Rubin and the venue have endured through the difficult times and he recently completed a successful Kickstarter campaign to produce the pilot episode for a live jazz performance series. Rubin's past efforts have proven invaluable in this endeavor, as his extensive experience has enabled him to handle many production tasks in-house and prepare material on a lean budget.

While the challenge of balancing artistic and business goals is substantial, Rubin has demonstrated the two can coexist creatively. "I'm really an artist, not a salesman," he explains. "I'm motivated by the art and the music. But I've been dealing extensively with what I call 'karma bucks." They take a long time to get; they can't be bought and you have to really earn them. They've afforded me the ability to do some

of these projects, because we're not really in

a money-making venture."

"The music business is tough now,"
Rubin admits. "The Internet has changed the delivery system so drastically. But I keep pursuing and I'm proud of the work and the playing I've done."

His first vocal showcase of the year will be Jan. 8 featuring **Elise Axelrad** and two other singers; for more information, visit www.saulrubin.com.

FRESH TAKES

Each year, many a jazz musician puts his or her best foot forward and records a demo CD to be submitted to the esteemed Thelonious Monk Jazz Competition. Since each instrument's competition usually comes up once every five years or so, players get a chance to really hone their craft and have a goal in mind for the next time instrument considered. is Saxophonist Godwin Louis is an example of a man who went the distance. In September, Louis took third place in the $20\bar{1}3$ Thelonious Monk Saxophone Competition, forever immortalizing his name among a coveted list of musicians who have placed in the competition since its inception in 1987. Louis will bring his group to the TriBeCa Performing Arts Center on Jan. 25, performing mostly his own original music.

Louis, 28, was born in Harlem to Haitian parents and was raised in Bridgeport CT and Port-Au-Prince. He began playing saxophone at age nine and his prodigious talent was soon evident. He cites his formal education with Herbert Wilson, a Connecticut musician, educator and behavior analyst, as his biggest inspi-

ration for pursuing music as a career. Louis attended Berklee College of Music for his undergraduate studies, where he had the chance to perform at New York's JVC Festival, the Monterey Jazz Festival and The Blue Note. Louis was accepted to the prestigious Thelonious Monk Jazz Institute at University of Loyola New Orleans for his master's degree and he graduated in 2011. While there, Louis had the opportunity to perform and study with Terence Blanchard, Herbie Hancock, Ron Carter, Jack DeJohnette and Dee Dee Bridgewater.



JAZZ ANECDOTE BY BILL CROW

Here's a story that **Ken Rizzo** sent me: Several years ago I was playing acoustic bass for the Sunday brunch at the Metropolitan Club. We were about to break from strolling when the leader, Paul Errico, saw Mel Brooks sitting at a table with four or five "suits." Paul said, "Before we break, we have to play something for him, but what?" "I know what to play," I said as we walked over to his table, where he sat with his back to us, I said, "Mr. Brooks, we have a song for you." Without turning around, he said, "No thanks, I don't want anything from *The Producers.*" "Not *The Producers*," I assured him. Still not turning around, he said more assertively, "No, I don't need anything from *Blazing Saddles* or *High Anxiety*, either." "Key of C, guys," I said, as I began a fast 2-beat, and sang, "A lion is eating my foot off. Somebody call a cop..." Brooks nearly fell out of his chair with laughter. Smiling ear to ear, he enthusiastically shook all of our hands, saying, "Thank you, thank you!" The "suits" looked on quizzically. He informed them, "That's from my record!" (His recording of *The 2000 Year Old Man.*)
